PRESERVATION OF WANDSWORTH COMMON.

WANDSWORTH, JULY 6th, 1870.

SIR,

The preservation of Wandsworth Common for purposes of healthful recreation and enjoyment is a question of deep importance to the owners and occupiers of property in the neighbourhood and to the Public generally. The present Lord of the Manor claims the absolute ownership of Wandsworth Common, and it is desirable for all parties that the question of right should be at once settled, instead of remaining in a state of uncertainty. Within the last quarter of a century this Common has been diminished to about one half of its former area, and encroachments are continually taking place. The present condition of a large portion of the Common, the enclosures which have been made, the unsightly holes and heaps of refuse in various parts, and the erection of buildings on the parts enclosed, give some idea of the future uses to which the remaining 150 acres will be applied if Lord Spencer's claim be established.

This question involves important rights and privileges which the Copyholders, the Freeholders, and the Public have enjoyed from time immemorial without any obstruction or hindrance, and it should no longer be left undetermined.

On the 7th of February last Mr. H. W. PEEK, M.P. for Mid-Surrey, wrote a letter to Mr. BUCKMASTER, of which the following is an extract: —

“ The public may grumble as much as they please, that will never stop encroachments or enclosures. What I have been thinking of is this; round Clapham Common there are many wealthy gentlemen, some of whom are beginning to be alarmed at Lord Spencer declining to renew the lease of that part which belongs to him—and in the neighbourhood of Wandsworth there are many well-to-do people. If these will pay £4,000 into a bank, I will add £1,000, and as a Battersea copyholder, would at once commence proceedings to take up everything irregular during the legal term, which I believe is 20 years.

“ I will hold myself bound to this offer till June, 1870, but no longer.”

In consequence of requisitions influentially signed, Public Meetings have been held in Battersea and Wandsworth, which were numerously attended, at which Committees were appointed to collect as large a sum as possible in each Parish.

A public meeting has also been held at Putney, and it is intended to convene similar meetings in the adjoining parishes, it being felt that this matter claims the sympathy and help of those living beyond the immediate locality; and that a successful issue in this case will stimulate the timely protection of other Commons, before encroachments are made upon them.
